CONNECT FOR EDUCATION

The AAT in Music - Associate in Arts in Music for Transfer - is earned by completing 60 transferable semester units (at the freshman/sophomore level) including both the major area of emphasis and the General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC). The AA-T in Music fulfills the first 60 units of required coursework toward a music degree at a California State University.

Students with this degree receive priority admission with junior status to the California State University systems and a guaranteed path of 60 additional units for earning a Bachelor of Arts degree in Music.

C4E's AAT in Music program will provide students from any California Community College the ability to access, participate, and earn the required credits toward transfer to four-year universities.

FULLY ONLINE

C4E's first fully online program is in partnership with American River College, Sacramento, CA where earning the AAT degree in music provides a path to priority admission in the California State University system and graduation with a Bachelor of Arts degree in Music through successful completion of an additional 60 units of coursework.

For the first time, access to fully online courses is possible through seamless integration of critical technologies built in C4E's comprehensive platform, OnMusic Companion (OMC). This platform enables the first fully online asynchronous/synchronous music degree program including Applied Music (instrument/voice performance-based courses with synchronous one-one-one instrument lessons), and Performance Ensemble where multiple players perform together simultaneously.

To earn an AAT in Music at CA American River College, students must meet the following requirements:

- Complete courses with a grade of C or better
- Have a minimum grade point average of 2.0
- Complete 60 transferable semester units
